

**Paul's Note** 

Tucson City Council, Ward 2



My colleagues and I met on Thursday this week instead of our usual Tuesday. We had a briefing that was very appropriate given our upcoming Veterans Day weekend. We got a presentation on the SkillBridge program.

In the military, service members can acquire a number of valuable skills. However, it can be hard for a veteran to adjust to a civilian workplace and often civilian employers have trouble recognizing what a veteran can bring to a job.

SkillBridge is a Department of Defense program that gives service members civilian work experience by putting them in training, apprenticeships or internships during their last 180 days of service. They do this with a number of partners in both private industry and government. The City of Tucson is one of those partners.

Our program here in the city has increased over the last year. We had 4 interns and 8 candidates in our "talent pipeline"; this year we have 13 interns and 22 candidates. SkillBridge interns are currently in seven city departments.

As much as I think it's important to bring in veterans because I'd like to see them supported and they are incredibly capable workers, there's also a fiscal advantage for the city. We have saved \$200,000 in labor and training costs through this program.

I'd like to thank the other two veterans on the council, Richard Fimbres and Nikki Lee, for getting this update to us. Their leadership on veterans' issues has been inspirational.

Every year the University of Arizona Adaptive Athletics program picks a program or charity to help out by playing an exhibition game to help them raise funds. The Regional Transportation Authority is hosting a series of open houses for the public to review and provide input on a \$2.46 billion, 20-year draft plan for regional transportation improvements.
